TEXT A

WHAT IN THE WORLD IS 'PLOGGING'?

- If you are new to the term 'plogging', sit up and take note. This is the running craze that is sweeping the streets from Sweden through Thailand to London and now, South Africa. This new eco-friendly trend combines physical exercise with its mission to collect litter and help the environment. 'Ploggers' refer to people who clean up litter as they run. Talk about multi-tasking!
- The word plogging is a combination of the English word 'jogging' and the Swedish word 'plocka' which means 'to pick up'. This movement was started in Sweden by trail runner Erik Ahlstrom, who encouraged litter collection while jogging. Environmentally conscious runners have now taken to collecting litter during their runs. Ploggers pull on their disposable gloves, grab a bin bag and 10 scan the streets for litter along their route. Once the bag is full, the litter is deposited in an appropriate recycling bin, thus reducing the amount of litter making its way into the ocean.
- Plogging introduces additional movements to exercise that could burn more calories and adds an extra purpose to daily workouts as ploggers are 15 contributing to a really good cause. Those that plogg regularly say it makes them feel even better in many ways. It keeps them motivated mentally and encourages them to add five more minutes of exercise, or plogg an extra kilometre, so they can collect those extra pieces of rubbish. Going an extra mile leaves most ploggers feeling inspired to do more for the environment. Plogging 20 can also be done while walking, cycling or hiking. Basically, it just means combining exercise with picking up rubbish and therefore it is beneficial to all.
- Plogging has numerous benefits for both the plogger and the planet. To become a successful plogger, one must have a positive attitude towards trying something new and a willingness to get a bit dirty. Many ploggers like to carry their own reusable garbage bags. Runners should keep in mind that the whole point of plogging is to stay in motion, so they will not be able to pick up every single piece of litter along the route. It is advisable that one gets a plogging buddy who can help collect the pieces left behind.
- Community members can also get involved by joining a plogging group in their 30 area or even arranging their own plogging challenge. New ploggers can simply get a group of runners together, bring along some rubbish bags and protective gloves and set out on a run. While running, ploggers will sneak in extra exercise by bending down again and again to pick up litter.

7	In order to make plogging a trend, ploggers can post about their participation on social media to make it even more fun. They can share ideas and encourage others to start plogging. More than 60 000 photos of runners, who participated in plogging all over the planet, have already been posted on social media. It also does not really matter where they are plogging because 90% of plastic that pollutes the oceans comes from land-based sources. It is therefore important to have plogging clubs in all communities. We all have our part to play in reducing pollution. Plogging is a great way to help solve this problem since it is a free and easy way to train while giving runners an opportunity to take care of the environment. The responsibility to save the planet by making it cleaner and healthier does not only lie with the environmentalists. We should always remember that if all hands are on deck, the load always feels







The number in the heart and the sugar cubes clearly indicate the amount of sugar contained in each drink. The hearts suggest the link to the Heart and Stroke Foundation. Drinking water is the healthiest option as it contains no sugar.

No.

It does not succeed as sugar is known to provide energy. People who require energy will still consume drinks with a high sugar content. The text does not completely discourage people from drinking sugary drinks as the Heart and Stroke Foundation only makes a recommendation. The arrows between the drinks are confusing as they move from one drink to the next.
