TEXT A

SOUTH AFRICA BREWS UP ROOIBOS TOURISM

- 1 Rooibos tea is an exceptional South African product that has captivated the global market, reaching over 30 countries. It is growing in popularity due to its various wellness properties. Few things soothe the soul as much as a steaming cup of tea, but South Africa's indigenous tea is more than just a beverage.
- 2 Due to its numerous health benefits, unique flavour and caffeine-free properties, Rooibos tea is celebrated widely. Rooibos has been integrated successfully into various products, from cosmetics to culinary flavourings. This versatility or flexibility speaks to its appeal as a wellness product. It is perfectly positioned to be the cornerstone of South Africa's wellness tourism. 5
- 3 Rooibos tea thrives mainly in the Cederberg area in the Western Cape. The Cederberg area is part of the Cape Floristic Region, a World Heritage Site and one of the world's biodiversity¹ hotspots. The breathtaking landscapes of this region offer vast potential for ecological and adventure tourism. The region showcases a significant opportunity for sustainable development through tea tourism, particularly focusing on Rooibos tea. More than 70 000 tourists visit the area annually. Most of the residents live in rural settings, and tourism is a critical part of their livelihood as it contributes significantly to their income. 10 15
- 4 Professor Martinette Kruger from North-West University forms part of the research unit known as Tourism Research in Economics, Environs and Society (TREES). She conducts research in collaboration with Curtin University (Australia) that seeks to uncover and develop the numerous tourism possibilities that rooibos plants hold. Their research explores both the supply and demand sides of the Rooibos tourism sector, and aims to identify the industry's challenges and opportunities. Kruger says that by promoting rooibos as a unique element of our national identity, we can create various tourism experiences that appeal to people all over the world. 20 25
- 5 The research explores the full potential of rooibos, aiming to enhance and differentiate the region's tourism offerings. These include rooibos-related travel routes, as well as tea cafés and educational tours.
- 6 The focus on Rooibos tea does not only promote a product, but also celebrates a rich cultural legacy. The findings of this research could be used to create experiences that resonate deeply with locals and visitors, highlighting the cultural and economic importance of rooibos. 30



7	In a landmark recognition, the European Union awarded Rooibos tea the prestigious Protected Designation of Origin status in 2021, making it the first African product to receive such recognition. This designation secures the South African origin of Rooibos tea and celebrates our rich agricultural tradition, making Rooibos tea a compelling attraction for international tourists. Integrating rooibos into South Africa's tourism offerings is an exciting opportunity for development.	35
8	Two significant milestones that form the foundation for the expansion of Rooibos tea as an attraction for tourists were the establishment of the Rooibos Route in 2017 and the 2019 Access and Benefit-sharing (ABS) agreement. The ABS agreement ensures that the local communities receive fair and ongoing benefits from the commercial use of Rooibos.	40
9	Moreover, the Geographical Indication that legally prevents other areas from branding their products as Rooibos will enable South Africa to market rooibos more effectively. This label connects the quality and reputation of rooibos directly to its South African roots. Such strategies have been successful in other contexts, such as wine tourism.	45
10	The tourism sector can exhibit the entire journey of Rooibos tea (from leaf to cup) through tourism packages. By concentrating on rooibos – from its cultivation to its deep cultural and historical roots – the authenticity of the tourists' experience can be enhanced. Rooibos is a cultural treasure and a gateway to experiencing South Africa's unique fauna and flora.	50

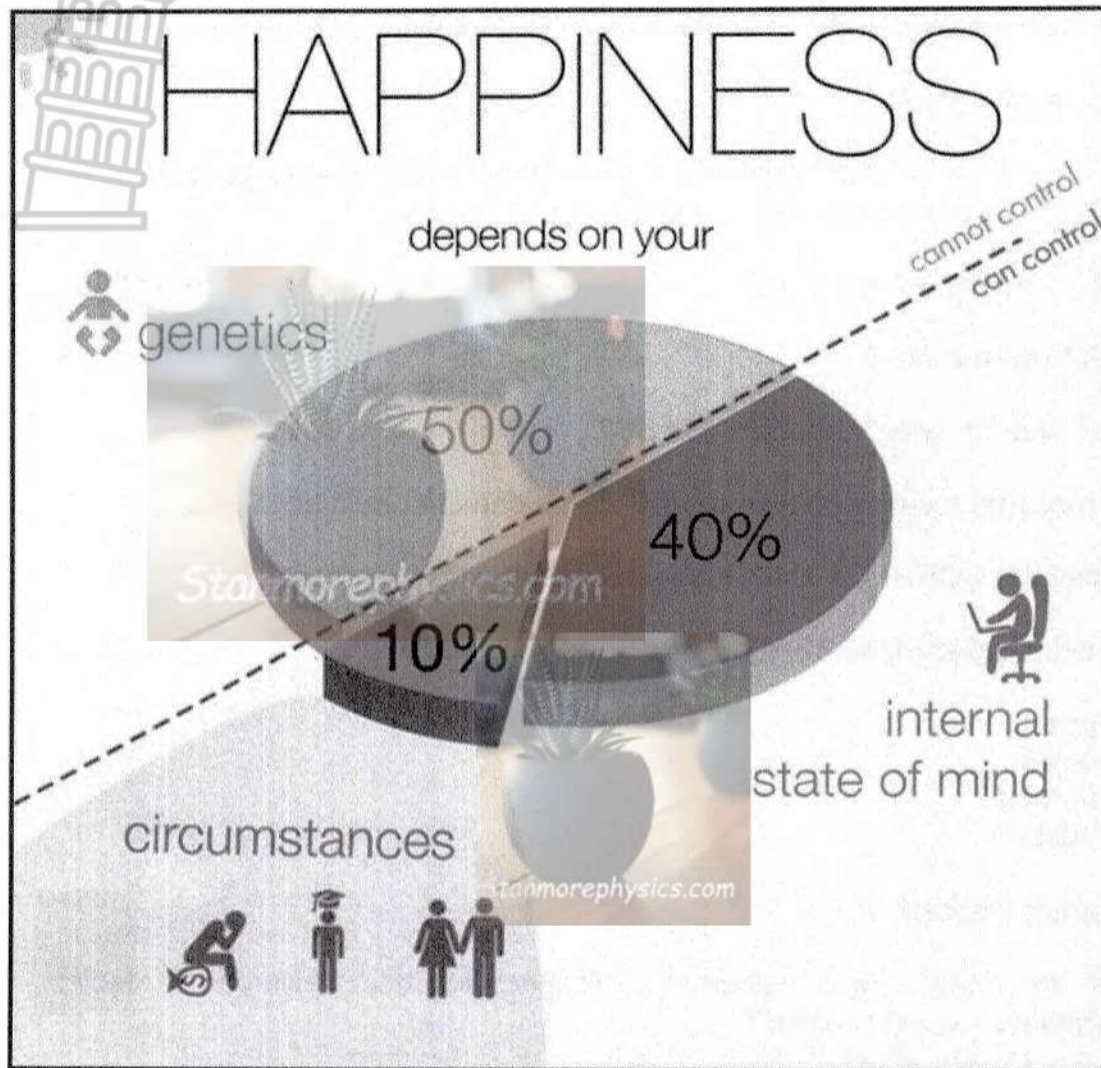

TEXT C

HOW TO CARE FOR BOOKS

Although printed books are not as popular as they used to be, they are still valuable. It is therefore important to know how to take care of books.

If you do not already own a book shelf, buy one as you will need it to store books. You can also display picture frames and decorations on the book shelf. Keep books in an upright position by supporting them with book ends so they will not get damaged.

Always ensure your hands are clean when handling books. This will prevent you from transferring dirt or stains onto the books. Also consider using protective book covers or sleeves to prevent wear and tear.

Many people fold the pages of books to remember where they stopped reading. You should use a bookmark all the time, preferably a flat one. This will protect your books.

The spine of a book is important as it holds all the pages together. When picking up a book stored on a book shelf, hold it in the middle of the spine and pull it out carefully. This helps to preserve and keep the spine in place.

Direct sunlight and any high intensity light are not good for books as they cause fading of paper and colours. Books should be stored in places with good lighting as this will enhance their lifespan.

Children and pets love playing with books, especially if the books are left lying around. Therefore, it is important to keep books out of their reach.

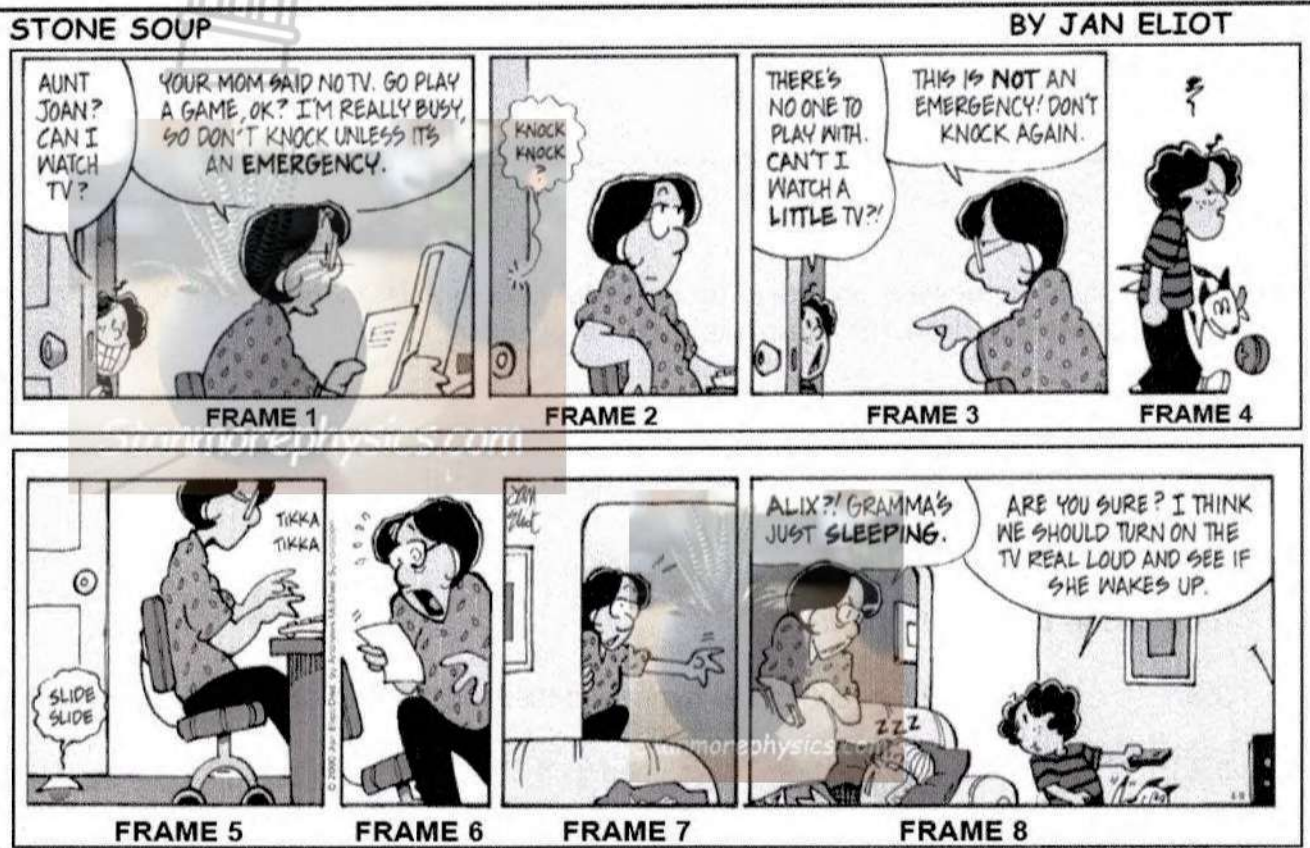
